Stručná anotace:

Cílem pracovního listu je seznámení žáků s principem tvoření nepřímých otázek v anglickém jazyce a to postupem od již známé gramatiky, tedy od otázek přímých k nepřímým, a následné procvičení této látky. INDIRECT QUESTIONS

Make direct questions from the indirect ones:

INDIRECT QUESTIONS: e.g. Can you tell me what the time is? Could you tell me how much it costs? Do you know who the president of the USA is? Can you tell me when we celebrate Christmas? The questions you have formed are so-called direct questions. The other four questions are called indirect questions. We use them when we ask politely for the answer. When we ask for information, we usually say: Do you know....? Can/Could you tell me....? Do you happen to know....? Do you have any idea...? May I ask....?

The word order is different from a direct question:

How old are you? X Can you tell me how old you are?

!!! Be careful with do/does/did questions:

What do you see in the picture? X Could you tell me what you see in the picture?

What time does the first lesson begin? X Do you know what time the first lesson begins?

Why did Peter leave so early? X Do you happen to know why Peter left so early?

When there is no question word (why, what, who, etc.) use "if" or "whether" in the indirect question:

Did you know that? X Can you tell me if (or whether) you knew that?
